One child dies every 5 seconds due to hunger-related causes

Then Feed Just One, working in conjunction with Mission Honduras LeMars, shipped 5 full containers of food to Honduras this past year. That represents 1,380,000 meals to those most in need in Honduras. The food is distributed to over 25 children's homes and orphanages, along


