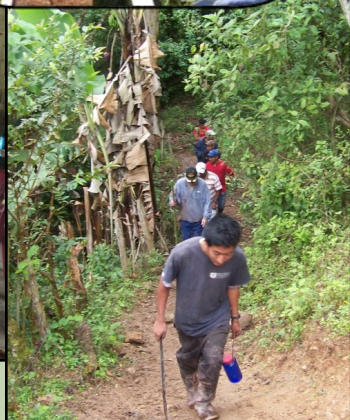
MHL completed water projects in Guayuma & Moradois, greatly improving their quality of life

Then Feed Just One, working in conjunction with Mission Honduras LeMars, shipped 5 full containers of food & supplies to Honduras this past year. The food represents 1, 254,528 meals to the most needy in Honduras. The food is distributed to over 25 children's homes, malnutrition centers, and orphanages, with about half going to the Tolupan children of Montaña de la Flor. Most rural Hondurans live on \$1.25 per day



36% of Hondurans are unemployed or underemployed

Again this year, TFJO fed the students of New Life School in Haiti for one full school year

Chronic malnutrition can reach 48.5% in Honduras' rural areas, with a stunting rate of 34%. After age 2, stunting is permanent.

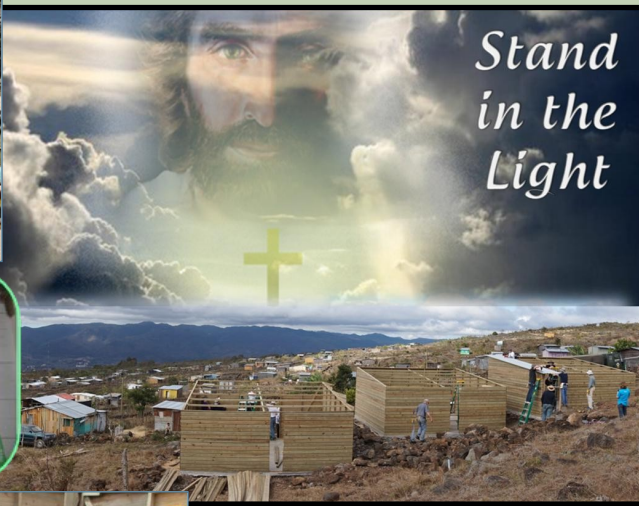
